Over the years, users have been able to take advantage of AutoCAD's capacity to perform many of the same functions used by professional engineers in a variety of industries. The AutoCAD user group has been instrumental in continually supporting AutoCAD and other Autodesk applications. AutoCAD is bundled with a wide range of Autodesk-branded and third-party CAD software packages. AutoCAD-compatible software packages include CAE, CAM, CAMWorks, Architecture, construction, HVAC, industrial, MEP, PLM, PLMDesign, Plant, Robots, SolidWorks, Shop, VR-CAD, VRT, and others. AutoCAD is available as a desktop application for Microsoft Windows, macOS, and Linux systems. AutoCAD LT is available for Mac OS, Linux, and Windows platforms. AutoCAD 360 is a web app that can be used from mobile devices, as well as Windows and macOS desktops. The AutoCAD Mobile App is a free mobile app that includes editing, viewing, 2D and 3D annotation, and document sharing. AutoCAD LT Mobile is available as a free mobile app that includes features similar to AutoCAD LT. In 2018, Autodesk released AutoCAD Architecture, a toolset for building information modeling (BIM) projects. AutoCAD Architecture is based on the BIM standards of ISO or IFC. In April 2018, Autodesk released AutoCAD Architecture 2020, a successor to AutoCAD Architecture 2017. AutoCAD Architecture 2020 can be installed on Windows, macOS, and Linux computers as well as mobile devices. In October 2018, Autodesk released AutoCAD 2020, a new release of AutoCAD that incorporates several design improvements, including the ability to export paper from AutoCAD models. It is the first release of AutoCAD since it was renamed from AutoCAD LT to AutoCAD. AutoCAD 2020 has been available as a desktop application for Windows, macOS, and Linux computers as well as mobile devices.
